 - b) **Methods:** shortly describe methods used
 - c) **Results:** summarize results obtained
 - d) **Conclusions:** state conclusions reached
2. Standard abbreviations may be used.
3. Inclusion in the Scientific Programme and Congress publications is dependent upon payment of registration fees.
4. Abstracts should be submitted in good English.
5. Abstract length should not exceed 250 words.
